

TRIED AND TRUE SCHOOL LUNCHEON RECIPES

Easy Holiday Crockpot Candy

Joan Buenger - St. James Lutheran Cookbook

16 oz. dry roasted peanuts salted 16 oz. dry roasted peanuts unsalted 1 (8 oz) pkg. German chocolate 1 (12 oz) milk chocolate chips 18 bars white almond bark

Layer in order in crockpot. Cook on low for 2 hours. Do not lift lid. After 2 hours, stir well and drop by teaspoonful onto wax paper. Cool completely. Makes a lot!

Holiday Spritz Cookies

½ cup butter, softened

l cup sugar

1 egg

2 tablespoons milk

½ teaspoon vanilla extract

21/4 cups cake flour

½ teaspoon salt

Food coloring/almond flavoring optional Holiday sprinkles and colored sugars to decorate

- 1. In a small bowl, cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the egg, milk, and vanilla. Combine flour and salt; gradually add to creamed mixture just until combined. Stir in food coloring if desired. Cover and chill for at least 2 hours.
- Fill cookie press and form into desired shapes on ungreased baking sheets.
 Decorate with sprinkles and colored sugars.
- 3. Bake at 400 degrees for 8 minutes or until edges just begin to brown. Cool on wire racks.
- 4. Yield about 5 dozen ENJOY!
