# TRIED AND TRUE SCHOOL LUNCHEON RECIPES

Just in time for Valentine's Day - a simple tea cake recipe to make heart shaped cookies!

#### **Tea Cakes**

3 cups flour

½ teaspoon salt

3 teaspoons baking powder

2 eggs

½ cup butter

1 cup sugar

6 tablespoons milk

1 teaspoon vanilla

Cream butter, add sugar and well beaten eggs. Add vanilla. Sift flour, baking powder and salt and add to the butter mixture a little at a time, alternating with the milk. Chill for at least an hour. Roll 1/8 inch thick and cut into desired shapes. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) for 8-10 minutes. (baking time was not given, but 8-10 minutes is what works for my oven) (Handwritten recipe from my mother)

Surprise your valentine with heart healthy pancakes for breakfast or dinner. For a fun twist make heart shaped pancakes!

## **Oatmeal Pancakes**

½ cup all-purpose flour

½ cup quick cooking oats (old fashioned oats also work)

34 cup buttermilk

1/4 cup milk

1 tablespoon sugar

2 tablespoons vegetable oil

1 teaspoon baking powder

½ teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

1 egg

Beat all ingredients in a medium bowl with a hand beater until smooth.

\*\*\* (I usually mix my dry ingredients together first and then add the wet ingredients. It works better.)

For each pancake, pour about ¼ cup of batter onto a hot griddle. Cook until pancakes are puffed and dry around the edges. Turn and cook other sides until golden brown. Serve with applesauce if desired.

Make 10-12 pancakes.\*\*\* I usually double the recipe.
